Dear Families

I hope that this newsletter finds you all well. By the time that you read it I hope that the weather has caught up with the fact that it is nearly June – we've had to put the heating back on in school! It's been a short but very eventful half term.

School life in the summer term is inevitably dominated by supporting students in their exam preparation and next steps either in school or beyond and taking the opportunity to celebrate the successes of all students both in and out of the classroom. Over this half term it has been great to see so many families attending our Parent Consultation evenings together and to have the opportunity to discuss progress across subjects with you.

We were pleased to welcome a team of inspectors into school last week who did a great job of quickly getting to know QE and celebrating where we have made improvements as a school in recent years and validating our assessment of where our next steps need to be to strengthen our provision. We look forward to sharing the Ofsted report with you when it is published before the end of Summer Term.

Much work is continuing behind the scenes with a dedicated team from Ted Wragg Trust and community partners to move the College House refurbishment project along with many structural surveys now complete so that plans can be formulated. I will keep you updated of developments on this over the coming months.

As you can imagine, talk of phones and their use has been the important topic of conversation across the school in recent weeks and we have included the information from our recent assemblies with students in this newsletter. We will inform you of progress and plans on this as we move through the next month or so.

Next half term is always incredibly busy. We are looking forward to welcoming Year 6 students to Lower School (Barnfield) and Year 8 students to Upper School (Western Road) as we support them in their progression through QE. We will be enjoying enrichment week with Years 7-9 in the last week of term. Year 9 will receive their GCSE courses and Year 10 will be sitting their first GCSE practice papers in the Exam Hall before completing work experience. We will say farewell to Year 11 and Year 13 and celebrate with them at our Summer Balls and assemblies.

Ten Tors



This year, QE fielded one 35-mile team and two 55-mile teams, each of whom trained tirelessly over many months in some extremely demanding conditions. Training regularly took place in harsh winter weather, including heavy rain, freezing temperatures, strong winds, and difficult terrain. Despite these challenges, attendance and morale remained consistently high. Team members showed remarkable perseverance, pushing themselves physically and mentally during long-distance hikes, navigation exercises, overnight expeditions, and endurance training across Dartmoor and other challenging environments.



Ten Tors



The event itself was a memorable and rewarding culmination of months of hard work and preparation. An early start at 5:00am on Saturday saw all teams preparing kit, making final checks, and heading to the start line for the 6:30am departure. After watching the traditional parachute display and listening to the Ten Tors prayer, the teams set off across Dartmoor with determination and excitement. Throughout the weekend, they faced the physical and mental challenges of the route with resilience and teamwork. On Sunday, all three teams successfully and victoriously crossed the finish line, an outstanding achievement that reflected their dedication, perseverance, and countless hours of training. One of our 55-mile teams achieved the fastest time ever for QE 55-miles.

The training team are incredibly proud of every student who took part in this year's challenge. The determination, effort, and positive attitude shown throughout the months of preparation and during the event itself have been exceptional. Watching all three teams cross the finish line was a moment of great pride and a testament to the hard work, resilience, and teamwork displayed by every participant.



Junior Maths Challenge



Congratulations to all the Year 7 and Year 8 students who took part in the recent United Kingdom Junior Maths Challenge. This national competition challenges students to answer mathematical reasoning and problem-solving questions, encouraging deeper thinking through rich and thought-provoking questions. A special mention goes to five of our students who achieved Gold certificates and have been invited to take part in the Grey Kangaroo follow-on round:

Overall, across Years 7 and 8, we are proud to celebrate the following achievements:

Duke of Edinburgh



Our DofE programme has had a fantastic year so far, with many students starting to achieve their Bronze Awards.

Year 10 Groups A and B (60 students) have successfully completed their Bronze qualifying expeditions in March and April. They should be incredibly proud of their achievements—and we are extremely proud of them at QE. Over the course of the expedition, students covered approximately 18 miles across challenging terrain, walking from Exmouth to Beer, and camping in very cold conditions.

A huge thank you goes to all the volunteers who supported these expeditions. Your time, effort and commitment are invaluable in making these opportunities possible for our students.

Year 9 Group A has recently completed their practice expedition, and we are looking forward to heading out with Group B on 5th–6th June.

Looking ahead, we have a busy and exciting schedule:

- Year 10 and Year 11 Silver expeditions will take place in June and July
- Our final Gold expedition will run during the summer holidays



On a personal note, I was very fortunate to attend a special event at Buckingham Palace on Wednesday 20th May to celebrate 70 years of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award. It was an incredible experience—I had the opportunity to see Prince Edward, The Duke of Edinburgh, and to celebrate the impact of DofE alongside others from across the country. It was also a lovely moment to reflect on the past eight years of leading DofE at QE, alongside such a supportive and dedicated team.

Finally, a huge congratulations to all students who have now completed their Bronze Award. We hope to celebrate this achievement with a DofE Awards Evening in the Autumn Term.

STUDENT FAQs

Answers to common questions about Yondr pouches and our phone-free school



1. How can my family contact me?

They can contact school reception in the usual way and we will pass the message on.



2. What if I need to contact home?

Speak to student reception at social time and they will help you do this.



3. What if I use my phone for medical reasons?

If you need your phone for medical reasons, you will be given an accessible Yondr pouch.



4. Will my phone be safe?

Yes. You keep your phone with you in your Yondr pouch all day. Store it safely in your school bag.



5. What if my pouch gets damaged or I am caught using my phone?

Your phone and pouch will be collected and home will be contacted. A family member will need to collect the phone. Deliberate damage may mean a replacement cost of about £18.



6. What if I do not have a phone?

Let us know and we will give you a pass. We may check from time to time that nothing has changed.



7. What if I do not want to use a Yondr pouch?

If you bring a phone to school, you must use the Yondr pouch. If you do not want to use one, you must not bring a phone onto site.



8. What if I forget to unlock it at the end of the day?

This is very rare. You can come back to school to unlock it or have a phone-free evening.



9. How quick is unlocking?

Very quick — it takes less than a second. Staff will help at unlocking stations if needed.



10. Will it cost my family anything?

There is no charge for current students, including current Year 6 students. A replacement pouch costs about £18, and new starters after October 2026 will also need to fund a pouch.

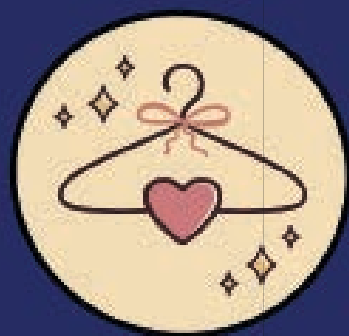

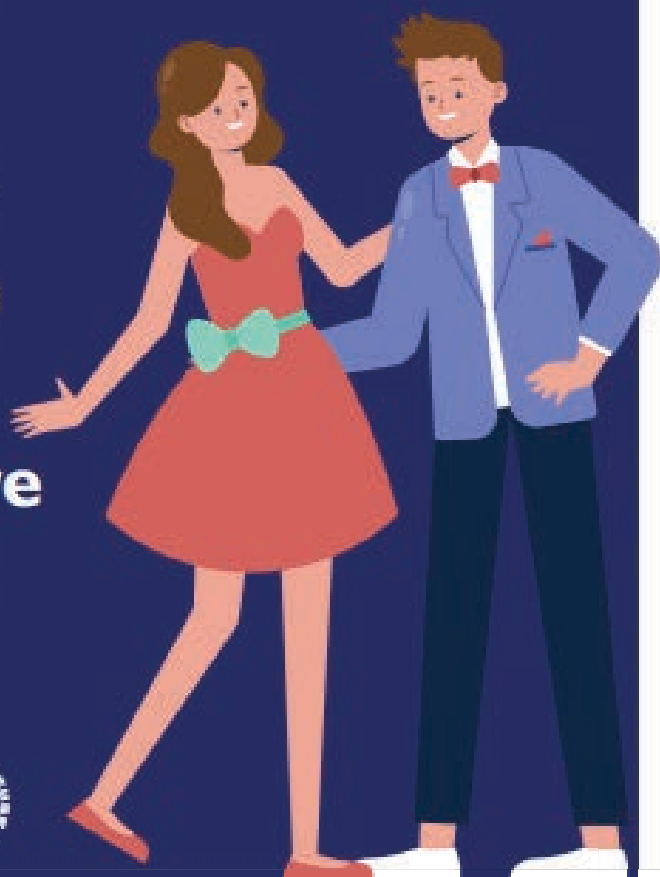

Mobile Phones

As a school, our priority is to ensure that all students feel **safe, connected and successful** during the school day. Mobile phones can be extremely useful tools outside of school, but their presence during the school day can create safeguarding, wellbeing and behaviour incidents.

Why mobile phones can cause difficulties in school

When phones are accessible during the school day, we see an increase in:

- **Distraction from learning** - impacting concentration and academic progress
- **Social media issues** - including online conflict spilling into school.
- **Safeguarding concerns** - such as inappropriate content, filming or image sharing
- **Heightened anxiety** - particularly when students are in constant contact with home
- **Behaviour incidents** - often linked to refusal to hand over phones when asked

Mobile phone policy

To support a calm and safe learning environment:

- Mobile phones should be **"off and away"** on school site during the school day.
- Phones should be **switched off and kept in bags** from arrival until the end of the day.
- This includes **breaktime, lunchtime** and **waiting for the bus**.
- Phones may only be used **after students have left the school site**.

If a phone is seen or used during the school day, it will be confiscated for the remainder of the day.

After-school use

Once students have **left the school site**, responsibility for mobile phone use transfers back to families.

We encourage parents to continue discussing:

- Appropriate social media use
- Screen time boundaries
- Online safety and respectful communication

How parents can support

We are extremely grateful for the support of families in helping us keep students safe. You can help by:

-  Not calling or texting students during the school day.
-  Contacting reception if you need to pass on an urgent message
-  Reinforcing that phones should remain switched off and away.
-  Talking regularly with your child about social media safety and online behaviour
-  Monitoring apps, privacy settings and online interactions

Reducing phone use during the day allows students to focus on learning, build positive relationships and feel more secure in school.

Communications

As you will be aware, we use a secure online system called Bromcom to send out general information, newsletters and trip messages etc. to parents and carers via email. Please ensure you have added the communications email address - mcas@qe.tedwraggtrust.co.uk - to your safe sender list, this should help ensure you receive communications from us promptly and that your provider doesn't filter them to spam.

My Child At School (MCAS)

We also use a secure online system from Bromcom called My Child At School (MCAS) to keep you up to date. With MCAS parents and carers can:

- Check their child's attendance
- Check their timetable
- Keep track of positives/negatives awarded
- View homework
- View reports
- Send and receive messages.

If you have a smartphone, both you and the school can save money when you download the 'MCAS' app from your app store (Android and iPhone).

MCAS accounts are generated for parents and carers when their child joins the school, if you didn't activate it at the time, please visit

Bromcom Student Portal

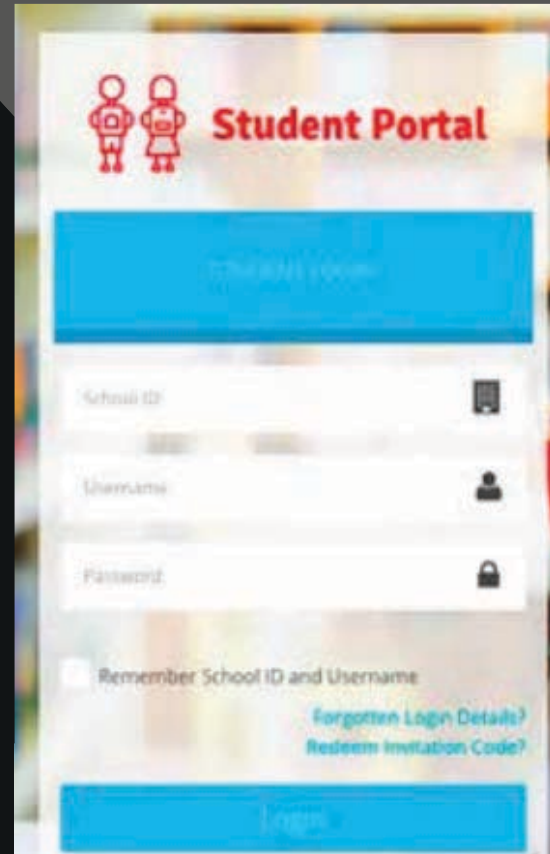
All students were sent an email to their school address containing an invitation code and a link to set up their accounts. They can complete this by locating the email and following the simple steps to activate their Bromcom Student Portal account. Please encourage your child to access their account, as it will allow them to view homework and other important information.

Please note that the invitation code is only needed for students to create their accounts initially, once they've done this they will use the following to login:

School ID: 13768

Username: Unique to the student (usually their surname followed by a series of numbers, it is NOT their email address)

Password: This will be what they chose when they set up the account.



There is a tick box to allow students to 'Remember School ID and Username' so that they only need to input their password each time they log on subsequently.

If your child reports to you that they've tried logging on but are getting the message 'no such user found' this may be because they are trying to use the Redeem Invitation Code link again. Please direct them to click on the 'Back to Login' screen and try again. If they're unable to remember their password then they can use the 'Forgotten Login Details' link to reset this.

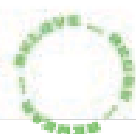

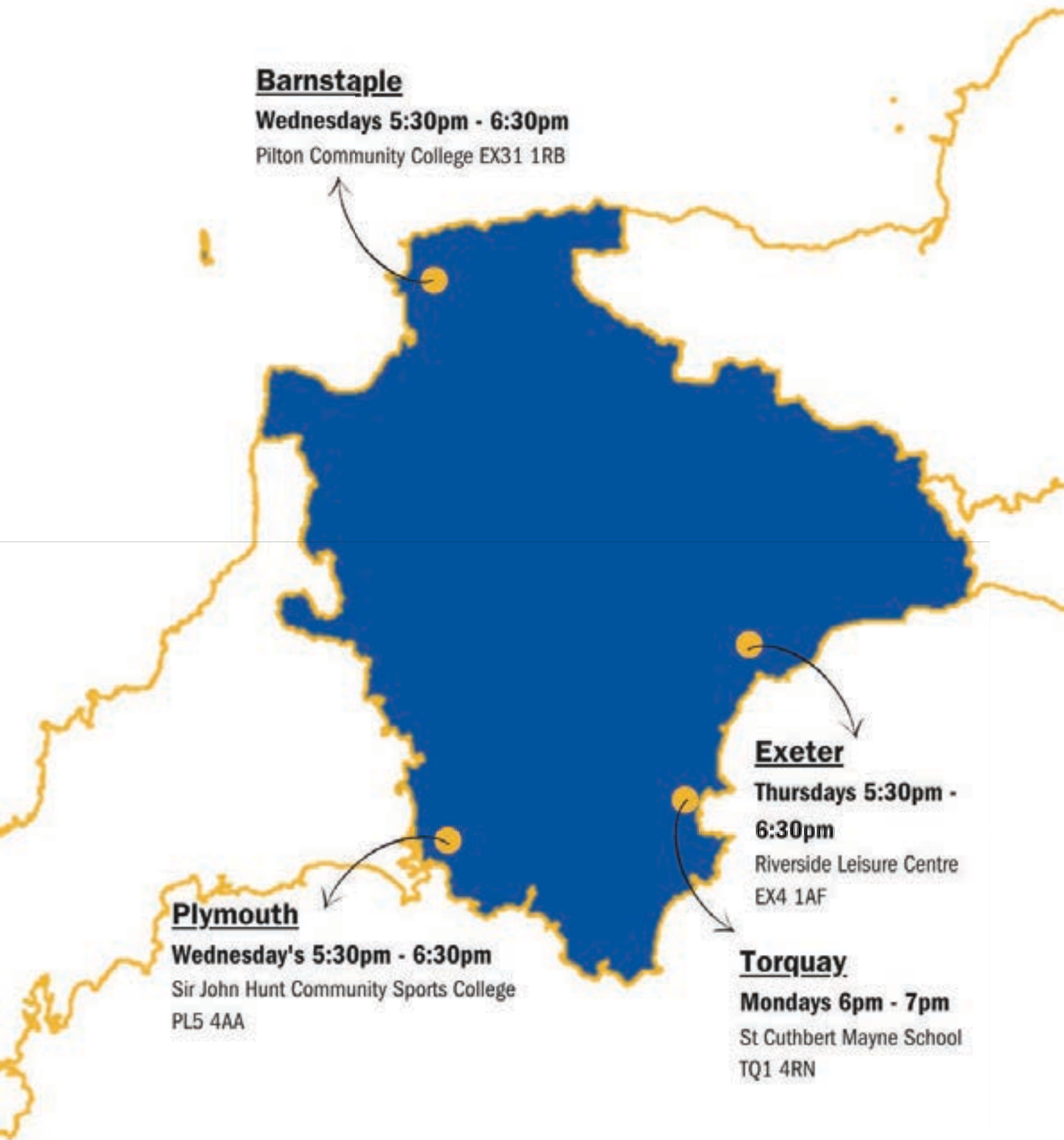
